and getting every game covered. Once again this proved to be an "interesting" task as 7 a side competitions were sprung on Harry with 10 minutes notice!!

It is hoped that the Development opportunities offered to Edinburgh referees can be expanded and made available to all referees at the tournament next year. The dates for 2005 are Monday 18th - Friday 22nd July.

One highly disappointing element to the week for all involved when referees who have indicated their availability either don't show up or call to advise that they are not available for the



evening session. This is not acceptable. You would not call a League Secretary after 5pm to tell him that you could not do your game that evening unless there was some emergency that had only just arisen. However it is clear that some members knew far earlier in the day that they were not going to be able to attend in the evening and waited until after 5pm to make the call. This left no time to arrange cover and meant that some evening games took place without assistant referees.

By the end of the week the hard core of referees who had been there for the week were simply exhausted between the heat and the number of games they had to do - if you are available even on one evening then the tournament is on next year then your colleagues who have been officiating since 9.30am would greatly appreciate you giving up a night to assist.

Fife and the Future

The Development of the Association is critical to the ongoing success of the Association. The 2003 / 2004 season finished on a high for the Association with Brian McDuffie appointed as the Assistant Referee on the Tennent's Scottish Cup Final between Celtic and Dunfermline Athletic at Hampden Park. This was the third senior national cup final for Fifers last season with Stuart Macaulay appointed as Assistant Referee on the CIS Cup Final between Livingston and Hibernian at Hampden Park and Ricky Smith on the Bells Cup Final between Airdrie United and Inverness Caledonian Thistle.

Last season also saw Craig Marshall, Colin Brown, Steve Crichton and William Gilfillan officiating in the OVD Scottish Junior Cup Semi Finals. John Rowbotham, Kay Rogerson and Lorraine Clark officiate at the Scottish Women's League Cup Final, Ritchie Malcolm, Michael Gill, Andrew Harvey and Billy Millar officiating at the Under 21 Scottish Cup Final.

There is much to look forward to in the 2004 / 2005 season; Fife has acquired a Class 1 Category 1 Referee, Kevin Toner, on a Bosman from the Glasgow Association. Willie Conquer has been promoted on the Register of Senior Referees as a Class 1 Assistant Referee and Keith Maskell, Kevin Martin, Michael Gill and Neil Marshalsey have been promoted as Class 2 Senior Referees.
