Part V of the Police Act 1997 introduced a new system of disclosing criminal history information to individuals and organisations for employment and other purposes. To this end the Disclosure Bureau was established within the Scottish Criminal Record Office (SCRO) for the purpose of issuing certificates under Part V of the 1997 Act. This new service known as 'Disclosure Scotland' is responsible for issuing certificates known as 'Disclosures', which will give detail of convictions and / or other information, or indicate that there is none.

In this context it is now Scottish Football Association policy for all persons wishing to enter the refereeing movement to be the subject of a Disclosure with the Disclosure Bureau.
